

Districts & Office Information

The Chippewa Valley Council is divided into four Districts to better administer Scouting within geographic communities. Each is led by a team of volunteers (District Committees and Commissioner staffs) with the help and encouragement of at least one full-time staff member (District Executive). In addition, we provide support for Venturing and Exploring units on a Council level. Districts support the community organizations (such as churches, service clubs, and veteran's organizations) that charter Scouting groups, the volunteer leaders who work directly with youth members, as well as the unit-level volunteers who help administer the pack, team, troop, crew, and post program.
